Welcome to fall! The summer has flown by, as has my sabbatical. I am back in the office, catching up on six weeks of news, and gearing up for the coming months. I want to thank the church again for the opportunity to take that time for a period of intentional rest and renewal. It was a really wonderful time. So, you ask, what did I do during those six weeks and what did I take from the time? First, I spent a lot of time resting. It took almost two weeks just to rest enough to be ready to rest! Second, I had some wonderful opportunities for worship. I was able to visit a number of different churches and enjoy a variety of worship gatherings and styles, from your classic “big contemporary service” to a huge traditional Presbyterian church, to a brand new (6 months old) emergent community. I had some great – and some not so great – experiences, and met some amazing people. I think I may have discovered the absolute *worst* way to present a stewardship appeal in worship. Ask me about it and I’ll tell you the story in person!

The one thing that really stood out was how much the welcome (or lack thereof) from the congregation had an impact on me – as a worshipper. At one church we were greeted before we got to the door by someone who first introduced herself to us by name. When we got to our seat a young woman three rows up turned around to wave. During a discussion time three teens came over to chat. Someone brought the pastor over and introduced us, and the original greeter said goodbye in the parking lot, remembering our name. I’d go back there in a heartbeat (except it’s in Colorado). Contrast that with the church where I walked around carrying the ‘new visitor gift bag’ and a map for 15 minutes before worship, and never had a soul say ‘hi’. I’m not anxious to return. It was a strong reminder just how critical hospitality is for those seeking a place to worship. It was the community that made the biggest impact, not the style of the actual worship service.

Of course, not all of my worship was so formal. I was really blessed by the chance to have extended time to read, reflect, journal and pray. As those who were in my Lenten Small Group know, I’m *not* a habitual journaler, but I spent a lot of time writing – processing what I was hearing and reading and experiencing. I spent several days hanging out at Ox Bow Park, just soaking in the beauty of creation, and knowing that this is worship, too.

This is not to say the whole time was serious – not by a long shot. I also played! I was able to visit my husband Kip in Colorado, where he is temporally assigned to Peterson AFB in Colorado Springs. Since he won’t be home until early October, it was a real treat to spend that time together. I got to see part of our country that was new to me, and do a lot of wonderful sightseeing. During the Sabbatical I was also able to reconnect with several long time friends (one I’ve know since we were infants, and some others that I went through seminary with – 20 years ago), and travel to Kentucky to camp with family. And, I’ll be disappearing for a few days next week to go to Texas to see my son Patrick as he graduates from Basic Training at Lackland AFB.

One of the many books (14 at last count) that I read during my time away was *Velvet Elvis* by Rob Bell. I was really struck by his discussion of Sabbath, especially when he writes that “Sabbath is a day when I am fully available to myself and those I love most.” That was probably my biggest struggle – remembering how to find that balance of work and Sabbath, worship and play, family and friends – and how easy it is to get ‘out of whack.’ I’ve come back refreshed, but also knowing that I need to make some major adjustments to how I structure my time so my ‘sabbath’ doesn’t just come once every 20 years. I appreciate more than you know all the prayers and support during these past weeks, and hope that we all continue to share and learn what it means to structure our lives – and work – so we continually rest and trust in God.

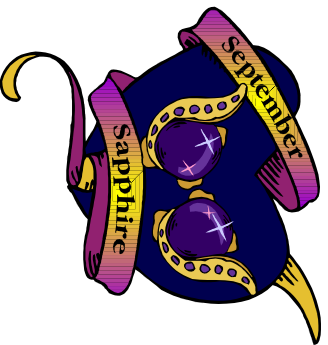

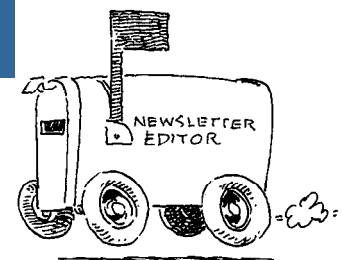
Tai Chi for Arthritis
