from the Pastor's desk

Pay Attention!

No, I don't have a major announcement. But I do want to focus on the question of attention. To what do you pay attention?

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus said:

Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

We usually interpret that statement in terms of earthly treasures – it is Jesus' warning to focus on spiritual treasures rather than material possessions. And, in this stewardship season of the church year, I don't want to discount the importance of that meaning. But I want to approach it from a slightly different angle: where you focus your attention.

For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. In Greek: *thesauros* (treasure) denotes both valued things and the box or receptacle in which they are placed. The location of your treasure influences where your *kardia* (heart) is located. "Heart" was the first century way of describing the center of your will, understanding, intelligence, and affections. Another translation of Jesus' words might be: "The box in which you place your treasure is also the place where you put your mind."

The more I think about this, the more I realize that *your attention is your treasure*. Your emotions and values follow your attention, as do your behaviors and even your identity. What you pay attention to determines what you *don't* pay attention to. (Jesus again: *You cannot serve two masters.*) Over time, where you place your attention determines who you are and how you relate to God and others. And — just ask those whom you love — your attention is often the most valuable gift you can give to others.

To what and to whom do you give your precious attention? This is an important question, one that we don't always stop to ask ourselves. We often, without thinking about it, let outside stimuli and other people capture our attention. Yet we have more control than we exercise. We can choose where to put the "treasure" of our attention.

So ask yourself: where do I focus my attention? On myself or on others? On my losses and grievances, or on my blessings and gratitude? On the things that cause me stress and anxiety, or on things that give me satisfaction and peace? On guilt over yesterday or on the pleasures available today? On the people I loathe or on the people I love? On fear of what might happen, or on hope for the good that might come? On things material or on things divine?

A personal example: At our house, mealtimes are "sacred." It's not that we talk exclusively about God or church; rather, that we focus our attention on one another. To this end, we don't watch TV or listen to the radio or read; we simply converse as a family. I think it would be hard to overestimate how important this has been in keeping our family close.

In his letter to the Philippians, Paul writes,

*Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable,
whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable,
if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise,
think about these things.*

Pay attention!

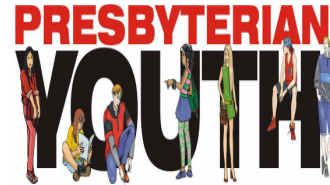

THE HOPKINS 4K FOR CANCER BICYCLISTS

ARE COMING TUESDAY, June 8...We will host the 28 cyclists on day 10 of their 63 day—4,000 mile journey across America—from Baltimore to San Francisco.



The idea of fighting cancer in extraordinary ways is what the 4K is wholeheartedly about.

Last Fall the students accepted this challenge—as is the challenge of dealing with cancer. They have each raised \$4,500 to participate in the 4K and 100% of these donations will be distributed to organizations dedicated to fighting cancer and to the Baltimore Hope Lodge (a free home-like residence for cancer patients).

The bikers foster HOPE by volunteering monthly at Hope Lodge, by emphasizing the importance of early detection of cancer through awareness campaigns in disadvantaged Baltimore neighborhoods and communities they visit while cycling cross country.



The PHYSICAL and MENTAL CHALLENGE of cycling for 4,000 miles reinforces the conviction to fight cancer and the obstacles and deep hurt cancer causes in the lives of so many people.

You are invited to JOIN THE CYCLISTS for dinner on Tuesday evening—June 8—at 7:00 p.m. in Fellowship Hall. They will share their personal purpose and challenges with us. The dinner is compliments of our Mission Commission and dessert is compliments of Elkhart's United Cancer Association.

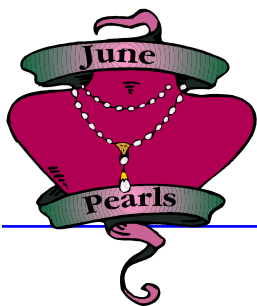

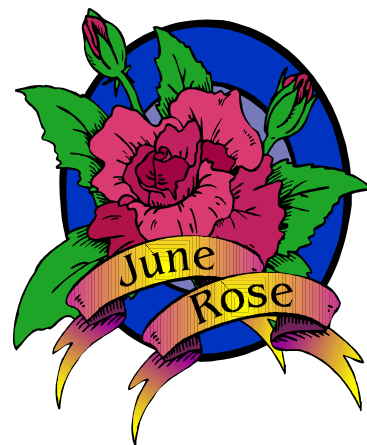

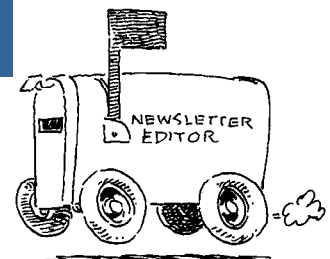

FISCAL YEAR ENDS; NEW FISCAL YEAR BEGINS

We are ending our 2009-10 fiscal year. This is the first full year of our new June 1-May 31 fiscal year. As the year draws to a close, and as we are in our pledge campaign for the upcoming 2010-11 fiscal year, here are a few notes from the stewardship team.

1. **Is your pledge up to date?** As of the end of April, we were significantly behind on our pledged income. Please check your giving record (call Cinda in the church office if you have questions) and try to bring your pledge current before the end of May. This will greatly improve our year-end situation.

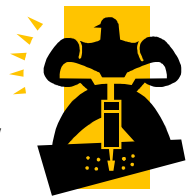

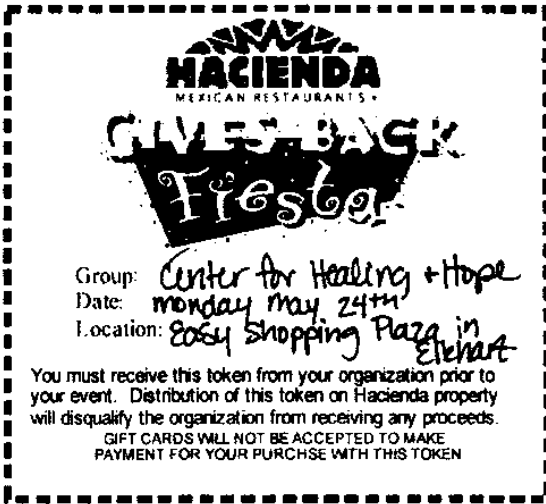
² \$16,000 was borrowed from other church funds to make an initial payment to Church Community Services. This must be repaid from campaign receipts.
