from the Pastor's desk

In the beginning was the Word...

Thus begins the Gospel of John. In a sense, the Old Testament also begins with God's word, as God speaks into existence the heavens and the earth in Genesis' first creation story. Speaking and communication are at the heart of our faith. I've been reflecting on communication lately, with the convergence of several things:

Wireless Microphones: Due to a recent ruling by the Federal Communications Commission, our church has to replace almost all of our wireless microphones. Why? With the completion of the transition to digital television last June, television stations no longer use the frequencies in the 700 MHz band. The FCC has reallocated those frequencies for use by public safety entities (e.g. police, fire and emergency services) and commercial providers of wireless services (e.g. wireless broadband). Most wireless microphones also operated in the 700 MHz band, and such mikes are no longer permitted, lest they interfere with the new uses. Hence, we are replacing most of our sanctuary, chapel, and Bridge wireless microphones.

Such replacement does not come cheaply – it is costing us almost \$10,000. As you can imagine, it has caused some grumbling. But our church seeks to be a responsible member of this community, fully supporting our public safety services, and we will be one of the first churches to comply with the ruling.

How are we paying for this? Through the generosity of people who have made memorial contributions to our church in recent years, we have sufficient resources in our Covenant Memorial Fund to cover the cost. Thank you to all who make memorial donations – they are set aside for unexpected expenses such as these.

Does this have any spiritual significance? It is a sign of our changing world, and in particular to the changing nature of communications. Which leads me to my second point.

Websites and Social Media: When we ask visitors and new members how they first learned of our church, a surprising (to an old-media guy like me) number say it was through our website. Among younger generations, even websites are increasingly passé; now it is Facebook and other social media. With the help of Lain Downs, now leading our invitation ministry team, we are exploring how to more effectively use our website, email, and social media.

Are you familiar with and interested in such things? We are putting together an advisory group to guide us into more effective usage of digital and social media. Please speak to Lain Downs, Steve Braden, or Kathleen O'Connell.

Multiculturalism: Our son, Mason, is currently in Mexico with the I.U. summer language program, studying Spanish. (Anyone interested in following the group's activities can do so through their blog: <http://sanluispotos.blogspot.com>). Why? Because fluency in Spanish is becoming ever more useful. As I've mentioned in recent sermons, through my work with the Michiana All Peoples Church in South Bend, I attended the Presbyterian Church's Multicultural Conference in Chicago at the end of May. In my mind, multiculturalism is not only about ethnicity. It also includes recognition of the difference between print and digital cultures and modern and post-modern cultures. To the extent that our traditional and Bridge services seek to accommodate both, we are already a "multi-cultural" church. But do we need to do more to engage an increasingly multi-ethnic Elkhart County?

Such questions aren't easy, but they are important as we seek to speak and embody God's word of love in our changing context. Let's keep communicating as we explore these issues.

Six youth were confirmed that day as well! See page 8 for more details.

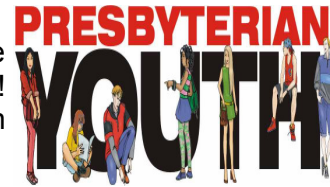

Last year's discussion gave us the idea for our *Take it to the Street* mission day. What will we think of next? Please come help! Talk with Connie Minzey if you want to know more or if you can't attend this meeting but want to get involved in new mission activities.

CHURCH FINANCES...We have some good news. First, through the continued generous giving of our members and friends, savings from the new HVAC system, and the careful stewardship of our resources, we finished the fiscal year 2009-10 "in the black."

This was a very tight year, due to the economy, and we had to tighten our belt. In order to avoid staff salary reductions, we cut the budget to the bone and looked to our church's Foundation to help support mission and trustee expenses that normally come out of the operating budget. The Foundation Committee agreed, on a one-time basis and as long as the expenditures were within the purposes of the respective funds. This stratagem, along with faithful giving and reduced energy costs, has enabled us to finish the year with a small surplus.

Second, the pledge campaign for 2010-11 has gone well so far. The stewardship team is contacting people who have not yet returned their pledge cards, but initial pledging has been strong. It appears that we will be able to return to more normal procedures for funding mission and trustee-related expenses. The budget as passed by the session will be presented at the June 27 congregational meeting.

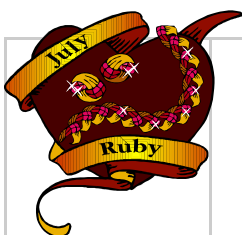
Our Congregation is Hosting a Conference Worship Service

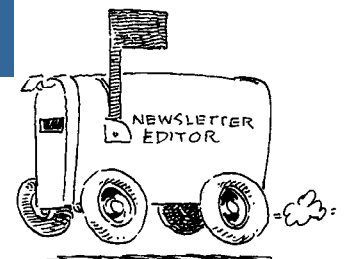

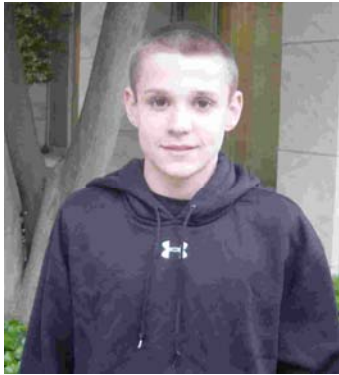

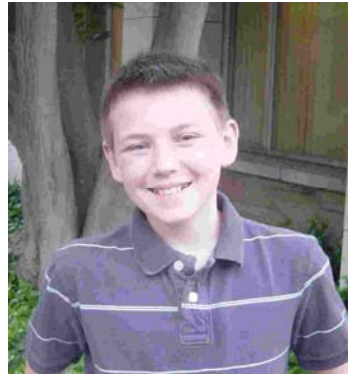
