As I write this, I'm also preparing to finally take off for a brief summer vacation. Why are vacations so much work???

But, next week will see me and my husband Kip hopping a train for Minot, ND. I know – not your typical summer vacation destination. What's in Minot? Not much (other than a Scandinavian Heritage Center and a Curling club - both of which I hope to visit), but it is currently home to our son, daughter-in-law, and their new baby. I was able to spend some time with them there when Dylan was born back in March, but Kip has yet to meet his grandson. Needless to say, we are both greatly anticipating this trip!

Though it does, I must say, have me pondering the way that life surprises us. Just when we think we have it planned....God has other ideas.

You see, when Kip was first in the Air Force (too many years ago for him to admit) he was stationed in Minot. He endured those brutally cold winters and very hot summers in the middle of nowhere. It was his very first posting, and he SWORE that he would NEVER return. We just never quite counted on Patrick enlisting or that he would follow his stepdad's footsteps straight to North Dakota, with a wife and child. Trust me, absolutely *nothing* short of that would drag Kip back there. As is it, it's certainly not what we ever would have expected, but we can't wait. Our God is full of surprises!

I'm a planner. Many of you know this. I have my to-do lists and I love to organize and know what to expect. But life often takes unexpected turns and I need to remember that sometimes *my* plans are not God's plans – and the surprises are often wonderful grace moments, if we can see them. A wonderful woman in one of my previous churches used to start each day by saying "OK God, this is what I think I'm doing today. What do you think I'm doing?" It was her way of reminding herself to be open to the unexpected, and listen for God's voice in the midst of it. She was a very wise woman. I'm still learning that lesson.

I try to remember her example when the unexpected comes along. What was it John Lennon said.... "Life is what happens when you're busy making other plans." Or as a Pastor friend of mine used to say when someone would apologize for dropping in when he was in the middle of some office work, "the interruptions *are* my work. The rest just keeps me busy between the God moments." We don't really know where life will take us. Sometimes we have to let go of our expectations to see what God has in store for us. God Moments.

When Patrick was young, and I was a single parent, we used to treat ourselves out to dinner at Pizza Hut. At that time they had a little table top video game. I think it was Pacman. (Yes, it's been awhile, and it was a very old Pizza Hut!). The game constantly ran a demo, and he would sit there, moving the joystick, having a blast, and thinking that he was controlling the game. Life changed the day a babysitter showed him that by actually putting a quarter in the machine, all the little blips on the screen would move where he directed! (My quarter supply changed too!) That image has always stayed with me. Sometimes I think I do the same - go through all the motions as if I'm in control, only to be reminded that it's just an illusion.

No, we never envisioned ourselves looking forward to spending summer vacation in Minot, ND. Kip has been wandering around muttering "Never say Never" for the last few months. And I'm reminded that God is full of surprises. We'll enjoy visiting the Scandinavian Heritage Center (my family is Norwegian, so that actually sounds fun to me). We may even catch a game of Curling. Mostly, we'll revel in spending time with family. As the summer draws to a close, may you find some rest and renewal. And may you keep your eyes, your heart, and your life open to the unexpected grace moments that God drops into our midst.

SUNDAY SCHOOL CHILD REGISTRATION

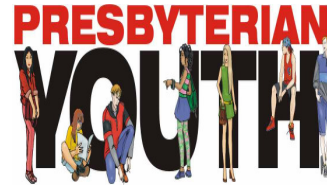

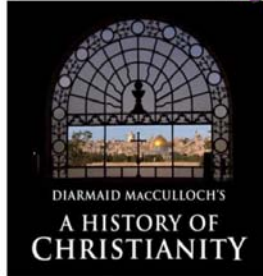

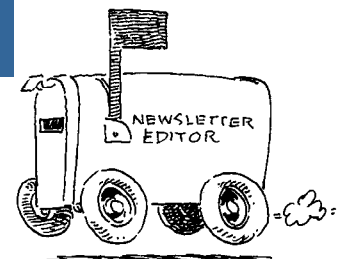

Through the generosity of our members in the October Peacemaking Offering, we are able to award \$500 Presbyterian Peacemaking Scholarships each spring to graduates of four area high schools: Central, Memorial, Concord, and Jimtown. The recipients are chosen by the faculty or staff of the schools on the basis of exemplifying peace-making in school life.

Three of the four were present and recognized at our Jazz Sunday service. Congratulations to Aubrey, Jorge, Zach, and Adrianna — and thanks to Connie Minzey and the mission team for making this happen.

Our recipient from **Elkhart Memorial High School is Aubrey Strati:**

The teacher who nominated Aubrey felt she was the perfect recipient for many reasons. Aubrey works with freshman students and presents a positive attitude to make certain they have a safe and successful high school experience. Aubrey likes to volunteer, giving back to her community. She loves to brighten someone's day by bringing peace and happiness into their life. Aubrey was a peacemaker on the drill/dance team and encouraged cooperation among all the members of the team. Her mission is to be a "ray of sunshine in everyone's lives."

At Central he has been a positive link between ethnic groups. At home, at school, and in the community Jorge is a peacemaker and a positive role model.

I tremendously value this grant because it is going to facilitate in my University bills and help me in completing my goals. So many opportunities, so many doors can open for me, at times with funds available and opportunities due to the contribution that this congregation has established. Thank you!

I entered and practiced in helping reconciliation between students when I myself was entangled in a verbal disagreement and after attending this program realized that just talking about our differences with a mediator alleviated a lot of tension and opened our thinking towards a passive solution.

I then realized that conflict will always exist because in America we are all raised to stand up for our beliefs and rights and at times as humans we fail/neglect to see that just like ourselves, others have ideas and opinionated views also. We all want justice yet we all need to realize that justice is created for peace. I want to communicate to you that my grant will be spent wisely and on my education needs, such as text books and tuition.

I plan to provide my service in the medical field but as I enter my classes I will find which branch leads into my career. I will attend the University of Central Florida with a branch into Seminole College since I am an out of state student and the tuition for the first semester will be a bit over my limit. The second year should be a bit more comfortable.
