and a time for every matter under heaven:*

As I reflect on the state of our church, and perhaps our world, the wise words of Ecclesiastes come to mind. There are rhythms to life, times and seasons, that are beyond our control. And part of wisdom is to recognize these rhythms, and seek to draw our lives in harmony with them.

from the Pastor's desk

a time to be born, and a time to die;

In this newsletter you will see a birth announcement – Sam & Mindy Weirich's new baby, Elizabeth -- and two death announcements – Alice Fuller and Dr. Herb Cormican. Indeed, as I write this column I am also preparing for Dr. Cormican's funeral. Births and deaths remind us that we are all finite creatures of an infinite yet loving God. The God who gives us life has also promised us that, in some fashion beyond our understanding, life continues beyond the grave. In life and in death we belong to God.

They also remind us that our lives have times and seasons of growing up, and of "growing down." The former is hard; the latter is often harder. It is difficult to adjust to the new realities of aging – infirmities, pain, limited mobility, the knowledge that robust health will never return. "Old age is not for sissies," it has been said, and one of our tasks as a congregation is to help our members adjust to the latter seasons of life.

*a time to plant,
and a time to pluck up what is planted;*

Though few of us are farmers, the metaphor has deep meaning. We have students, including my son Mason, graduating from high school. They have been blessed to "harvest" the results of the "seeds" of hard work they have planted and tended over their school career. And those in our congregation involved in the school system, or who have taught Sunday School or helped with our youth group, can see their own "planting" come to fruition in these youth.

It is also stewardship season. We are in the midst of our *Saints Alive! Living Generously* stewardship program, in which we invite our members and friends to sow seeds of generosity, and reap the spiritual benefits that only a generous heart can provide. We are also nearing the end of our capital campaign. Each time the church's heat or air conditioning come on, and each trustee meeting without discussions of major HVAC problems, we are reaping the harvest of the generous giving to that campaign. More importantly, we now have a facility that can serve us for the long haul, enabling us to continue to sow seeds of faith in succeeding generations.

*a time to kill, and a time to heal;
a time to break down, and a time to build up;*

These are not my favorite lines — there has been too much killing of people in the name of Christ — but they remind us that there are things that we are called to kill: hate, prejudice, and other evils that divide peoples and destroy our souls. Sometimes things have to die, or be killed, to make way for new life; sometimes the old has to break down before the new can spring up.

*a time to weep, & a time to laugh;
a time to mourn, & a time to dance.*

And so, as a community of Christ's followers, we move through the times and seasons of life, grieving together, celebrating together, knowing that God's faithfulness is great, that God's love is with us in all the cycles of life. As we often sing, *Summer and winter, and springtime and harvest, Sun, moon and stars in their courses above, Join with all nature in manifold witness to God's great faithfulness, mercy and love.*

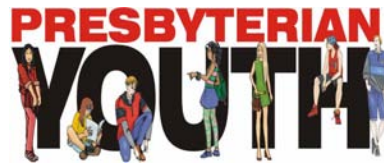

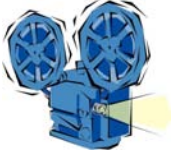

We're starting a **new support group** for those who care for loved ones with memory loss, chronic illness or increasing physical disabilities. Joining a support group can help you

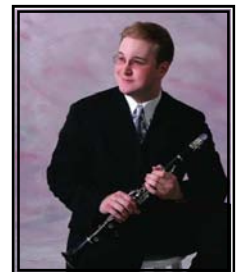
- ☞ Reduce stress,

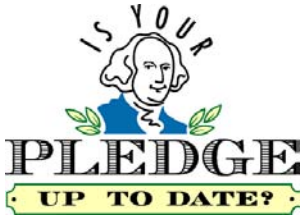

FINANCIAL MATTERS

We are ending our 2010-2011 fiscal year. This is the first full year of our new June 1-May 31 fiscal year. As the year draws to a close, and as we are in our pledge campaign for the upcoming 2011-2012 fiscal year, here are a few notes from the stewardship team:

1. **Is your pledge up to date?** As of the end of April, we were significantly behind on our pledged income. Please check your giving record (call Cinda in the church office if you have questions) and try to bring your pledge current before the end of May.
2. **Can you make an additional gift for this year?** For a variety of reasons, we find ourselves in a financial hole this year, and need some gifts over and above pledges. Can you help us with an additional gift? If you can, please mark your check "additional giving 2010-11." Thank you.
3. **Reminder on Stock Transfers:** If you give stock to the church, please call Cinda in the church office to let her know it is coming. Otherwise, we don't always know from whom stock transfers are made.

The Capital Campaign April 2011 Capital Campaign Update

Our three-year capital campaign is drawing to a close. The original campaign commenced in May, 2008, to enable us to replace our church's HVAC (heating and cooling) system, replace windows in the sanctuary, and do some needed roofing work, and other capital improvements. We tithed our campaign to mission projects, both local and global.

The campaign ends in May, 2011, and **we encourage everyone to complete their pledges** so that we can finish our projects and commitment to mission. **Thank you to all who have made pledges, and especially to those who have completed their pledges or even given amounts over their pledges.** The results as of the end of April:

Pledges Made (with known shrinkage):	\$1,014,830
Pledge Payments Received:	\$ 967,420
Extra gifts & other money received:	\$ 55,139
Total Monies Received:	\$1,022,559
Balance Remaining on Pledges:	\$ 53,747

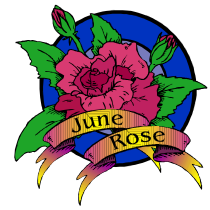
Remaining Projects to be completed from the original campaign:

- Reroofing north wing: \$23,000
- Payment of Tithe to Mission (\$40,000 to Church Community Services is complete):
 - \$40,000 for Malawi Matters and Ghanaian mission (allocation and exact use to be determined by African mission team)
 - \$10,000 for Presbyterian global mission
 - \$10,000 for the Presbytery of Wabash Valley

There were several important projects that were not funded in the original campaign, including restroom renovation, stove and dishwasher for the kitchen, resurfacing the parking lots, organ repairs, and deficit reduction. *Because of other financial needs, the session has voted to defer any extension of the campaign for these items.*

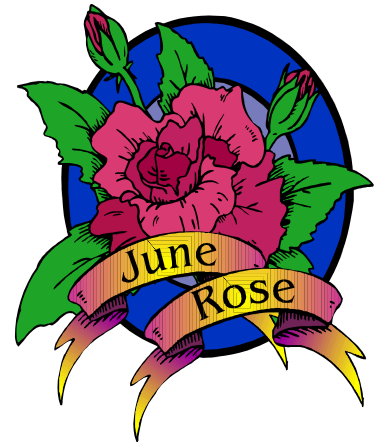

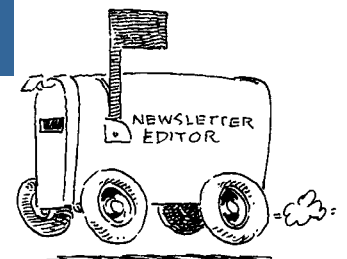

They were always met with a comfortable setting, a good cup of coffee and a snack, thanks to the generosity of the church and the PBJ volunteers. Our church can be proud of the support it provided to make PBJ a successful ministry as it has touched the lives and hearts of those attending and their families.
